**REQUESTING NEW YORK STATE LEGISLATURE ENACT  
SENATE BILL S.7283 AND ASSEMBLY BILL A.8218 REGARDING  
TRANSFER AND CONVEYANCE OF  
CATTARAUGUS COUNTY REFORESTATION PROPERTY**

Pursuant to Section 40 of the Municipal Home Rule Law  
and Section 219 of the County Law.

WHEREAS, Senate Bill S.7283 and Assembly Bill A.8218 have been introduced in the New York State Legislature, which authorize the County of Cattaraugus to transfer and convey reforested lands in the Town of Perrysburg to the State of New York, and

WHEREAS, the land authorized to be conveyed, by the County of Cattaraugus to the State of New York, is described as "Perrysburg Pond", "Crocker's Pond", and "Bob's Pond", and designated as Tax Map No. 2.003-1-20, and

WHEREAS, a necessity exists for the passage of such legislation by the New York State Legislature, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Cattaraugus County Legislature hereby requests the New York State Legislature hereby enact Senate Bill S.7283 and Assembly Bill A.8218, which authorize the County of Cattaraugus to transfer and convey reforested lands in the Town of Perrysburg to the State of New York, in accordance with the above-described terms, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the County Attorney be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to submit one or more Home Rule Requests to the New York State Legislature pursuant hereto, and be it further

**REQUESTING NEW YORK STATE LEGISLATURE ENACT  
SENATE BILL S.3527-A AND ASSEMBLY BILL A.6013-A REGARDING  
RATES OF COMPENSATION FOR ASSIGNED COUNSEL PROGRAM**

Pursuant to Section 722 of the County Law and Section 35 of the Judiciary Law.

WHEREAS, Senate Bill S.3527-A and Assembly Bill A.6013-A have been introduced in the New York State Legislature to increase the amount of compensation an attorney receives for representing indigent clients through the assigned counsel program, and

WHEREAS, the rates of compensation for assigned counsel under County Law §722 and Judiciary Law §35 have not increased since 2004, and still remain at \$60 per hour for misdemeanor offenses and \$75 per hour for felonies, appeals and family court cases, and

WHEREAS, it is nearly impossible to retain or recruit attorneys to perform this mandated representation at the existing rates, as evidenced by the fact that the administrator of assigned counsel has had to reach far beyond the borders of Cattaraugus County to find attorneys willing to provide this service, and

WHEREAS, Senate Bill S.3527-A and Assembly Bill A.6013-A propose to increase the rates for misdemeanor representation from \$60 per hour to \$120 per hour, and the rates for felony, appellant

and family court representation from \$75 per hour to \$150 per hour, with the increase to be funded by the State, and

WHEREAS, the Cattaraugus County Legislature strongly supports the passage of such legislation by the New York State Legislature, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Cattaraugus County Legislature hereby requests that the New York State Legislature enact Senate Bill S.3527-A and Assembly Bill A.6013-A, which authorizes an increase in the amount of compensation for assigned client representation, in accordance with the above-described terms, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Legislature is hereby directed to forward certified copies of this resolution to Governor Hochul, Majority and Minority Leaders of the State Senate and the Speaker and Minority Leader of the State Assembly, Senators Gaughran and Borrello and Assembly Members Weinstein and Giglio.
